Talk With Your Landlord Beforehand

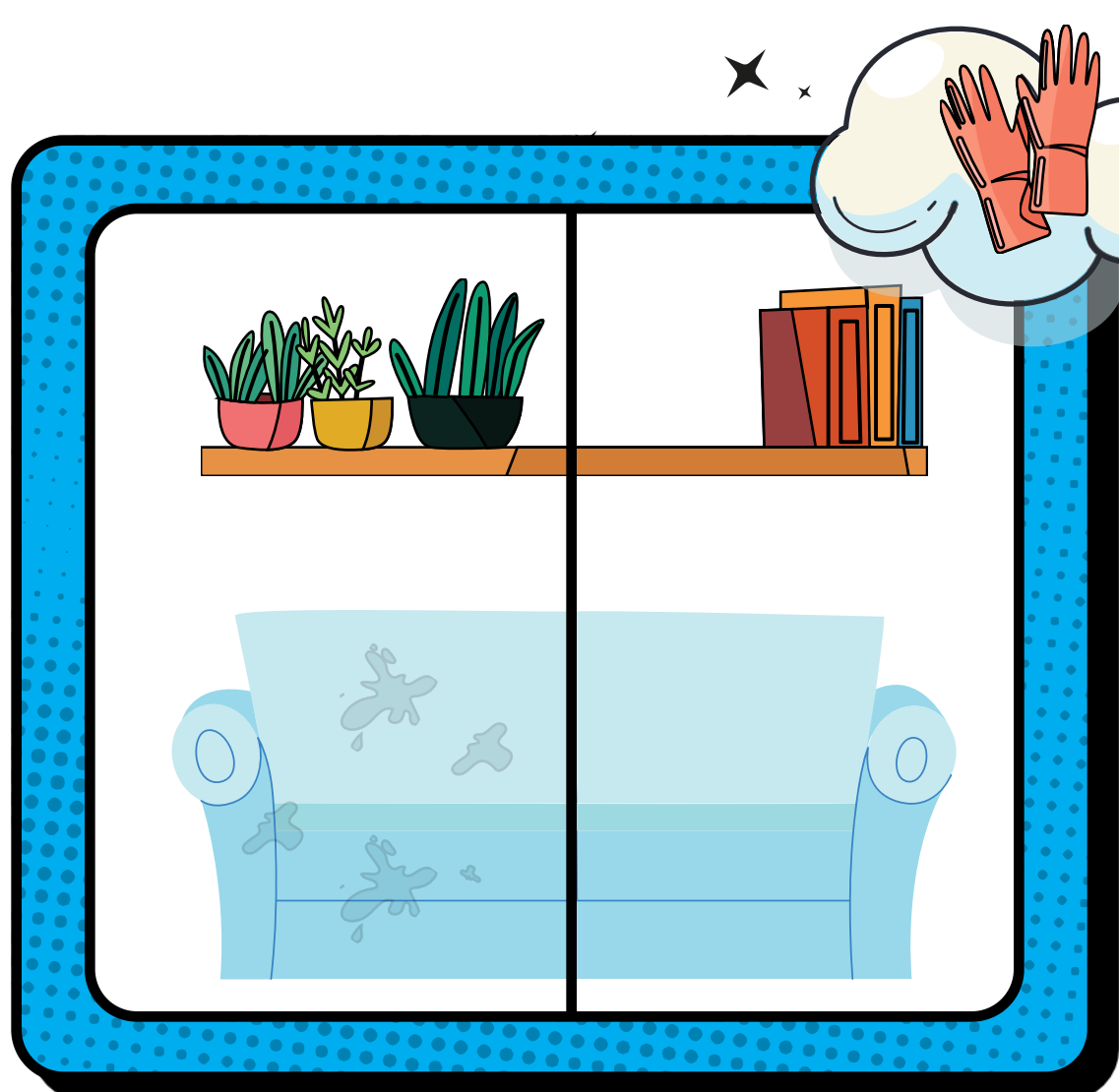


Wait Until The House Is Empty
