

**Use A Microfiber** 

Prevent scratches and smudges on your TV screen after finishing by using a microfiber cloth. These tools are softer than regular cleaning rags and are specially designed to attract and hold more dust than other cleaning tools.



Modern TVs are fragile and sensitive to the touch compared to older glass ones. Pressing too much or for too long can make the liquid crystals inside misalign or burn out, leaving a permanent mark on the screen.




## A must when you're cleaning electronics. Unplugging your TV


